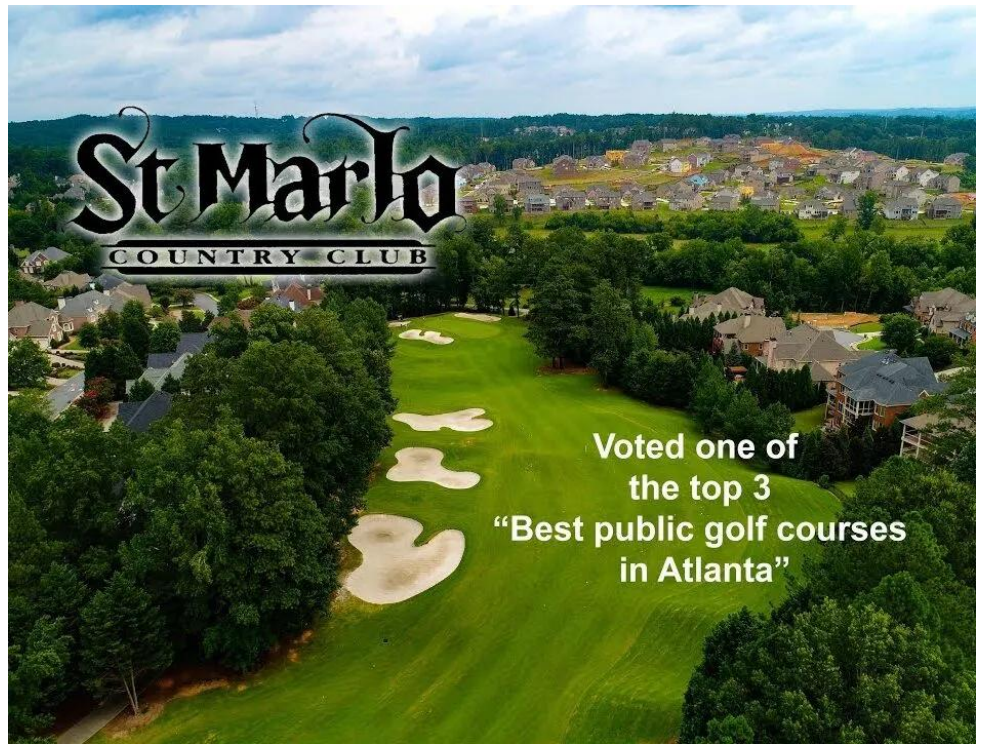

Volunteer for Special Olympics - May 23

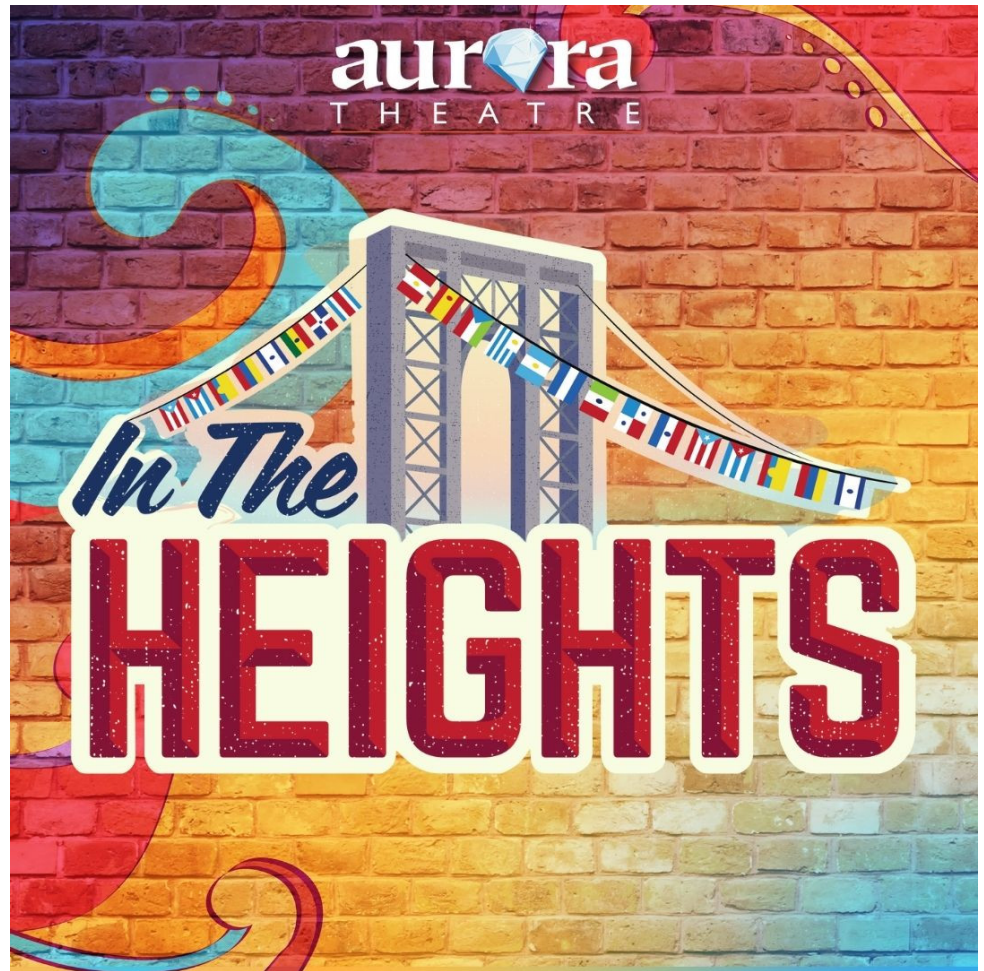
