Dunwoody Supports LifeLine Animal Project

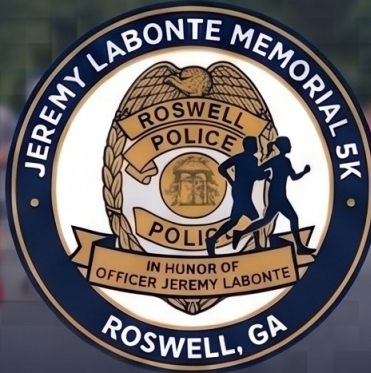
